DACA: Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals		DACA—EXPANDED
TIME FRAME:		
Eligible individuals may apply now .		It is unclear as to when eligible individuals will be able to submit applications.
ELIGIBILITY:		
1.	Under the age of 31 on 6/15/2012 .	No age cap. Can be born before 6/15/1981 .
2.	Arrived in the U.S. before age 16 .	
3.	Have continuously resided in the U.S. since 6/15/2007 .	Have continuously resided in the U.S. since 1/1/2010 .
4.	Physically present in the U.S. on 6/15/2012 and when application is filed.	
5.	Any EWI or lawful immigration status expired before 6/15/2012 .	
6.	In school, high school graduate, GED program or honorable discharge.	
7.	No convictions for a felony, a significant misdemeanor or 3 or more misdemeanors.	
8.	Must be 15 years old to apply.	
9.	Must have a birth certificate and government-issued photo ID.	
WHAT YOU RECEIVE:		
1.	Deferred action for 2 or 3 years. If the program remains in place, you will not be deported for 2 or 3 years. You do not gain legal status. This is a temporary protection.	Deferred action for 3 years.
2.	A time-limited work permit (EAD).	
3.	An authentic social security number, which requires DHS work authorization.	
4.	If you are eligible, you may apply for a Kentucky driver's license.
