## **DAPA: Deferred Action for Parental Accountability**

### ***TIME FRAME:***

Eligible individuals **may** be able to submit applications in **mid-to-late May 2015**.

### ***ELIGIBILITY:***

1.	You must be the parent of a U.S. citizen (USC) or long-term permanent resident (LPR) son or daughter born on or before <b>11/20/2014</b> .
2.	You must have continuously resided in the U.S. since <b>1/1/2010</b> .
3.	You must be physically present in the U.S. on <b>11/20/2014</b> and when application is filed.
4.	You must have no lawful immigration status on nor after <b>11/20/2014</b> .
5.	No convictions for a felony, a significant misdemeanor or 3 or more misdemeanors.
6.	You must have a birth certificate and government-issued photo ID.

### ***WHAT YOU RECEIVE:***

1.	Deferred action for <b>3</b> years. If the program remains in place, you will not be deported for 3 years. You do not gain legal status. This is a temporary protection.
2.	A time-limited work permit (EAD).
3.	An authentic social security number, which requires DHS work authorization.
4.	If you are eligible, you may apply for a Kentucky driver's license.

### ***WHAT YOU NEED:***

1.	Proof that you were in the U.S. on <b>11/20/2014</b> .
2.	Proof that you are the parent of a U.S. citizen (USC) or long-term permanent resident (LPR) son or daughter.
3.	Proof that your son or daughter is a U.S. citizen (USC) or long-term permanent resident (LPR).
4.	Proof of your identity.
5.	Proof you have been in the U.S. since <b>1/1/2010</b> . List of all the places you have lived since <b>1/1/2010</b> .
6.	Certified final disposition of any criminal conviction.
